

## Our learning this half term

The beginning of the half term is based around materials. We will be looking at the properties of different materials in science and which materials are most suited for different purposes. We will then look at materials in DT by carrying out a textiles project - this will involve researching, designing and then sewing our own Christmas stockings. (We may be asking for some volunteers to come into school to assist with the sewing at a later date!)

In English we will be comparing and contrasting spin-off versions of the Three Little Pigs. We will read the story of 'The Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig' along with 'The Three Little Pugs and the Big Bad Cat' before writing our own spin-off of the classic story. In the weeks before Christmas we will study the poem 'The Lonely Christmas Tree', a children's version of 'Twas the Night Before Christmas.'

In our R.E. lessons we will be learning about the theme of Jesus as a gift from God linked to the Christmas story. Our big question this half term is 'Why do Christians believe God gave Jesus to the world?'

### **Maths**

In maths this half term we will be learning to:

- add and subtract 1-digit and 2digit numbers
- find 10 more and 10 less than a 2-digit number
- solve missing number problems
- name and identify 2D and 3D shapes
- describe properties of 2D and 3D shapes (edges, vertices and faces)

## Reading

Please make sure that you read with your child as often as possible, and at least 4 times per week. This really does make a difference in helping children to enjoy reading and helps to reinforce their phonics learning. Reading diaries will be checked weekly. Children who have their reading diary signed 4 times each week will receive House Points and a reward at the end of the half term. Your child will have a set day for changing their reading books each week.

## What are some properties of materials?

Fragile, rough, smooth, transparent, opaque, hard, soft, stretchy, stiff, shiny, dull, waterproof/not waterproof, absorbent

## Key vocabulary:

brick - a hard, strong and rough material used tobuild houses

fabriic - a soft material used to make clothes

glass - a hard but fragile material that is usually transparent and is used to make windows

material - the matter from which an object is made

metal - a material used to make cars, cutlery and some musical instruments; it is usually strong, hard, and shiny

paper - a material that can easily tear used to make books and wrapping paper

pllastic - a material used to make bottles, toys and food packaging; it can be strong, but some plastics can also be squashed

properties - a characteristic of something

rock - a strong and hard material used to make roof tiles

rubber - a bendy material used to make carrynes and wellington boots

wood - a material made from trees that is used tomake furniture
