Personal, Social, Emotional Development

We understand starting nursery is a big milestone for children and we will support them to learn our class routines, make friends and introduce our school values. We will also begin to learn about our emotions using the story "The Colour Monster" by Anna Llenas.




Communication & Language

We will support the children to develop their communication and language skills by speaking with their friends and adults and developing their play ideas as a group. Each week we will have a focus song or poem which will practise everyday, this helps to develop children's vocabulary and will ensure that by the end of the year they have a large repertoire of songs and rhymes that they know by heart. I am sure the children will be able to teach these to you at home too!



Physical Development



To support the children's developing posture and muscles, we follow a variety of fun, interactive, exercise programmes to strengthen the parts of the body children need when reading and writing. These include 'Write Dance' and 'Dough Disco' alongside yoga and dance sessions. These gross motor activities are so important to help children develop strength in their shoulders, elbows and wrists which will have a positive impact on their handwriting when they move through school. We will also be showing the children what equipment we have to


promote their fine motor skills, including tweezers and threading resources.

We have daily outdoor sessions where we encourage children to explore moving in a range of ways such as running and climbing. We have PE equipment such as bats, balls and skittles for children to use and develop games as a group.

Literacy

This half term our key focus text is 'Peace at Last' by Jill Murphy We will be using story maps and puppets to help us join in with the repeated refrains and begin retell the stories ourselves.

We are also introducing a new initiative called 'Spotlight Books'. Each week we will have select a high-quality text which we will read to the children every day, the aim of this is to support children's language and vocabulary development, and encourage story telling throughout their play.



We will encourage children to give meaning to the marks they make when painting and drawing and practise writing our names at the beginning of each session.

<u>Maths</u>

In maths, we will learn to sort objects by a set criteria such as colour or size and begin to recognise and name shapes in the environment.

We practise counting daily through our everyday routines and within our play and will be learning lots of new number songs and rhymes.



The World

Over the half term, children will be learning about similarities and differences between themselves and others. We will talk about our families, our likes and dislikes and celebrate what makes us unique! We will use the book 'It's Okay to be Different' by Todd Parr to support these conversations and will paint self-portraits in a similar art style.



Alongside this we will be thinking about how our environment is changing as we move further into Autumn, as well as learning about Harvest and preparing for Harvest Festival.

Expressive Arts and Design

The children are encouraged to express their ideas and experiences by drawing, painting, building, telling stories through role-play and with small world resources.

We have daily singing sessions to help children learn a range of songs and nursery rhymes.
