Year 3/4 Half Term Curriculum Overview Autumn

English

In Year 3/4, the children will read Hurricane by David Wiesner. They will explore natural disasters, learn technical vocabulary, Rainbow Grammar and varied sentence structures to enhance their writing.



In guided reading, the children will read The Boy Who Grew **Dragons** by Andy Shepherd.



During our science lessons, we will compare and group together different kinds of rocks based on their appearance and simple physical properties. We will then move on to looking at state of matter. The children will compare and group materials and observe that some materials change state when heated or cooled.

The children will be introduced to the Spanish language and learn greetings.

In their art lessons, they will be introduced to the idea of making gestural drawing, exploring charcoal as a medium.

Maths

- Recognise the place value of each digit in a 3-digit number
- Compare and order numbers beyond 1000
- Find 10, 100 or 1,000 more or less than a given number
- Read Roman numerals to 100
- Round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1,000
- Count backwards through 0 to include negative numbers
- Add and subtract numbers with up to 4 digits using the formal written methods of column addition and subtraction

Computing

During our computing lessons, the children will be learning about making healthy media choices in their e-safety session and focusing on basic skills to navigate the computers.
