Dear parents/carers,

As we come to the end of another busy term I would like to thank you all for your support in what has once again been a trying term with Covid issues.

Today marks the first day since early 2020 when there is not free testing for suspected coronavirus infections. The advice on managing infections now talks about children with high temperatures and other Covid symptoms staying off school for at least 3 days (or until they do not have symptoms if longer than three days) or for three days after a positive test result if you take a test.

If there is Covid in the household, children may come to school if they do not show any symptoms but must be kept at home if they show any symptoms.

We will be reviewing all the various measures we have had in place that have helped us keep cases relatively low over the next term. Some of these have had significant positive impact on the school and we will let you know any changes to current practice well in advance of any changes so you will have time to adjust.

With rates as high as they currently are in our school community I would ask you all to please remain cautious and watchful and, if you suspect you or a member of your family has Covid 19 please do not send them into school with symptoms.
