### Covid Safety

As you will be aware, there has been a positive covid case in our Nursery bubble. I would like to remind everyone that it is still very important to adhere to the Hands, Face, and Space Government guidance, when you are dropping off and collecting your children. These are as follows:

- Face masks are worn by all adults until you are away from the school boundary.
- Social distancing is adhered to whilst you are waiting for your child to go into, or come out of school.
- If your child travels to school independently - **DO NOT** send them too early. We have had a number of Year 5 and 6 pupils arriving a good 20 minutes before their gate opens. We have had to speak (very sternly) on a number of occasions as they are not behaving in a way that we accept and are in fact putting themselves in danger.



### Sports Week

Next week is our Sports Week. Each class will have the opportunity to take part in disco dodgeball, yoga, laser tag, dance and other exciting sports activities over the week. As the activities are spread across 5 days, **children can wear sports clothing every day apart from Wednesday** as this is school photo day for some classes. They do not have to wear their school PE kit but must be appropriately dressed for physical activities and the weather.



## Update from Amarillo, Rosa & Verde (LKS2)

In Year 3 and 4, children explored electricity and had the chance to construct a simple electrical circuit, identifying and naming its basic parts.



They had the opportunity to observe the life cycle of a butterfly and enjoyed the moment they flew away into our woodland area.



A red fox, grey squirrel and European hedgehog visited our woods, so Year 3 and 4 children created a pamphlet about these woodland animals in their book and on a laptop, using basic processing skills on Word.



Over the next few weeks, children will be making a habitat for their chosen woodland animal, so hopefully we will get more furry visitors.

It looks like the children in our Lower Key Stage 2 have had a great few weeks. I look forward to seeing your habitats and the wildlife they attract soon.
