School Games Mark - 2022/2023

We are delighted to announce that Edgewood Primary School, have achieved the School Games Gold Mark Award for the 2022/23 academic year. This is only the second time in the school's history this has been achieved after successfully being awarded the Gold Mark last year for the first time.



The School Games Mark is a Government-led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success.

With a lot of young people competing in local inter-school competitions this year, we are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young volunteers, leaders and officials who made our competitions possible. Ready, Set, Read!

Once again we are encouraging children to take part in the Ready ,Set ,Read! Challenge which is delivered with the libraries.

Each child who completes the challenge will receive 10 house points to start of the next school year.

How to take part in the library

- Children sign up at the library to start their Challenge, picking up their Ready, Set, Read!
 collector folder.
- Borrow books and get reading! Children choose the books they want to read, recording what they have read on their folder. Library staff and volunteers are on hand to chat to children about books they have read.
- For every book read, children will pick up stickers (some are smelly!) along with other rewards. They'll also help the Ready, Set, Read! team weave through the obstacle course.
- Every child who completes the challenge, by reading 6 library books, receives a medal and certificate.

How to take part online

Children can also take part online for digital rewards

- sign up for a website profile direct at <u>summerreadingchallenge.org.uk</u> (children will be asked to provide a parent/carer email address to approve signup).
- Set a personal reading goal for the summer.
- Record the books read onto an online profile and leave reviews to unlock digital badges and online rewards
- Children will unlock a certificate to download once they reach their goal.

There is help and guidance available to support signing up to the online challenge here

Please note, the in-person and online Challenges are separate. Physical incentives like medals and certificates are only available via the library, for those taking part in the in-person Challenge.




