Update from Blue, Orange and Yellow Class (KS1)

Over the past few weeks in Key Stage One we have been continuing with our topic on 'Enchanted Worlds', which includes learning about all things living and growing. We have each planted our own sunflowers to take care of at home, and in our classes we are taking part in the 'Great Sunflower Race' to see who can grow the tallest sunflower, as well as experimenting with the conditions plants need to grow.



In our art lessons we have studied the artist Andy Goldsworthy, who uses natural materials to create different patterns and sculptures. In small groups, we recreated a similar style. We also practised our sewing skills to create some colourful owls to link with the text 'Tree: Seasons Come, Seasons Go.'
