Chewelry



Children who chew on non foods (hair, sleeves, collars etc) do it because they need oral motor sensory input. They crave the deep pressure that chewing provides to their gums. They use chewing as a way to cope and self-regulate. It can help them stay focused and is also an effective stress-coping behaviour. Chewelry are not toys and should not be brought to school unless a parent has had a discussion with the class teacher and/ or Mrs Bradley.
