PE and Sports Report 2019-2020

Sports Premium money has continued to provide high quality sports provision for the children by investing in the following:

- Training for the current Year 6 Sports Captains. Year 5 pupils also took part to support them to take over the role in 2020-2021
- Specialist PE providers for the delivery of Key Stage 2 PE Curriculum
- Involvement in the Ashfield District Sports activities and competitions
- Weekly after school clubs
- Restocking the PE equipment for PE lessons, afterschool clubs and Sports Captains activities.

Covid-19

Due to Covid-19, School was closed from 20th March 2020. This meant we were unable to hold Sports Week, take part in Race for Life Schools or take part in any more District competitions. We continued to support children and their families by sharing Ashfield District Sports competitions and activities on Seesaw, text and on Social Media. Next Level provided social distanced sports coaching for all Key Worker pupils in school from April-June.

Next Level Sports

Next Level Sports have continued to provide the delivery of the PE curriculum for this academic year for Key Stage 2 children and lead after school clubs for KS1 and KS2. Feedback from members of staff concerning the quality of teaching has been extremely positive. The lead coach has supported the new subject leader with developing our progression throughout PE curriculum document for KS1 and KS2 and has supported the school at District competitions.

Continued Development of Level 2 competitions

Where possible, Edgewood have entered into some sessions held by Ashfield District Sports. At the events we have attended, the children have really enjoyed participating and have done well. Our aim was to provide the opportunity to attend events for more year groups across the school, which due to staffing and lack of volunteers, this has not always happened. However, Next Level Sports have offered to attend events with the children where possible.

Sports' Week 2020

Unfortunately, Sports week 2020 was unable to take place due to School closures because of Covid-19. Possible events being planned for the week were: inflatables, cricket, archery, dance, gymnastics, lacrosse, clubbercise, ultimate frisbee and a boot camp. Again, Next Level sports were going to be our providers for most of these activities. We took place in the Virtual School Games ran by Ashfield District Sport. Out of our district, we came 9th for participation as a percentage of our School roll and 6th for KS1 participation.

Year 6 Bike ability

The bike ability course in Autumn enabled our year 6 pupils to develop their cycling proficiency, how to keep themselves and other safe when cycling and learn how physical activity and cycling positively affects physical health and wellbeing

PE budget spending 2019-2020

In the last academic year, as a school we received £18,681 Sports Premium Funding. Here is a breakdown of what we spent as a school in order to give our children a range of sporting opportunities.

School swimming	£17,838	From F2 to Y2 all children are given the opportunity to swim on a weekly basis to secure water safety skills and develop a range of strokes. These skills are consolidated in lower KS2 with over 10 hours of swimming for all children in years 3&4.
Specialist coaching	£16,800	Employing specialist coaches to deliver our Key Stage 2 PE allows the children to receive a higher quality of sports provision. The sessions follow units of work and develop the key objectives outlined in the National Curriculum. Teaching Assistants are present during these lessons and are able to observe and learn from the coaches. The coaches have offered advice for how TA's can be interacting with children with poor mobility and might not be able to access the session as well as their peers.
District membership	£850	Each year we buy into our local School's Game District which offers a range of Level 2 competitions. The membership also provides support to our PE coordinator and Year 6 sport's leaders
Interschool Ashfield District Football League Membership	£55	This allows our key stage2 children to take part in local football tournaments with other schools in the area.
Equipment	£787.41	We purchased necessary equipment to allow teachers and coaches to deliver our high quality PE curriculum including rugby balls, tennis balls, footballs
Afterschool clubs	£4326	Our specialist coaches' delivers afterschool clubs 3 nights a week so that children are able to experience a range of different sports and develop positive attitudes to physical exercise. The clubs link to School Games competitions where ever possible allowing children to show case the skills they have learnt whilst representing their school.
