PE Report Spring Term 2017-2018

We have had another busy and exciting term regarding PE where we have been able to offer the children some brilliant opportunities. Arguably the most exciting of these opportunities was going to watch the International Wheelchair Rugby in Leicester. In order to showcase diversity in sport we invited the whole of Key Stage 2. Due to the huge level of interest we received, we decided to increase the number of children who could go. In an attempt to promote inclusion within sport even further, and increase parental engagement, parents were invited to accompany their children. We used the Sport's Premium to completely fund the trip for all children and parents who attended.

We have continued to compete in several of the School Games inter-school competitions throughout the Spring term. Our mixed Year 5/6 Table Tennis team thoroughly enjoyed competing in such a large event, with the girls performing particularly well. Our greatest success this academic year came from our Year 5/6 Indoor Rowing Team who qualified for the District Finals. Using our School Games contact at Holgate we were able to obtain a Rowing machine for the children to practise between the qualifier and the finals. Their hard work and practise paid off and despite qualifying in second to last place we finished 4th in the district. This half-term we also took a team to the "B" Team Futsal competition, allowing us to give an opportunity to the children that don't usually get to compete in competitions.

Since the last report, Matt Nunn has taken on the responsibility as the main contact in school for Next Level Sport. The children in Key Stage 2 have been looking at Gymnastics and Dance in their indoor sessions this term. In order to offer high level sessions, Next Level Sport have allocated us a member of staff with Dance and Gymnastics as specialist area of expertise. The three after-school clubs that are funded through Sport's Premium continue to be regularly attended and we will be entering a football league organised by Next Level Sport in the Summer Term. Having formed a positive working relationship with Next Level Sport they have begun running their holiday sports camps at Edgewood during the holidays. Although funded by parent's themselves, both holiday camps have been well attended with a range of children from throughout the school.

Finally, the planning for this year's Sports' Week (2nd July to 6th July) is well underway with input coming from the 5/6 sports captain. We are also working with the PTA, who intend to hold the summer fair on the Friday of Sport's Week.
