We had an assembly this morning to pay our respects and also encourage the children to think about the amazing length of service from Her Majesty and all the changes that have happened during her reign. We spoke about the length of time she has reigned and how almost all of us alive today have never known anyone else to be on the throne.

We reflected together about the fact that while she was the Queen and our head of state, she was also a mother, grandmother, great grandmother, auntie etc. to a large family who will all be feeling her loss today.

We also spoke about how King Charles III is our new king and how his role has changed from Prince Charles to be the King. For a lot of children (and many of us as adults) this still feels so strange but it is important to start talking to children about it today and in the days to come.
