What else can children read?

All forms of reading are encouraged. This could be in the form of magazines, menus, comics – this can all be recorded in your child's reading diary as home reading.

Homework due every Thursday

- We expect children to be reading at home at least **4x per week**. **Please record all reads in your child's reading diary.** These will be checked each week to see how regularly they are reading at home and to see any comments made by parents/carers.
- **Spelling Shed** Your child will be assigned weekly spellings linked to the spelling rules they will be learning these will be tested every Friday and new spellings will be assigned on the same day.

How do we reward reading?

• In Year 3/4, we reward children who have read **4x each week for a whole half term** with a small treat. This is to try to encourage them with their home reading and to give them a boost and a big well done from us! This year's rewards are currently planned as follows:

Reading at school

- Reading is part of everything we do. The children have **weekly guided reading sessions** and are exposed to current and high-quality texts. The children are taught a range of reading skills such as predicting, retrieving information, grammar, vocabulary, giving opinions, explaining answers using evidence from the text, inference and exploring characters and settings.
- Each child will have **weekly spellings lessons** where they will learn new spelling rules.
- Every class will have a whole class read, which will give children opportunities to read aloud, showing understanding through intonation, tone and volume.
- Throughout the year, the children will be heard on a one-to-one basis, with an adult in school.
