### Welcome back!

We hope you have all had a lovely half term! It's hard to believe that we are now halfway through the academic year! Once again, this half promises to be very busy, with some events like World Book Day to look forward to, as well as catching up with you all at parents' evening in a few weeks.

### Topic this term

This half term we are continuing with our topic of '**Poles Apart**', with more of a history focus. This half term we are moving to the South Pole (Antarctica). After introducing the area in terms of its geography (weather and seasons, landscape, flora and fauna), we will study some famous explorers. Our introductory text to being a polar explorer will be 'The Great Explorer.' The explorers we will study are Ernest Shackleton and Robert Falcon Scott; we will consider their expeditions and if they were successful or not. We will make an explorer's compass using magnets. In our science lessons we will learn about the life cycle of an Emperor Penguin and food chains for animals found in the South Pole.
