








Year 5/6 Homework books

Each week in year 5/6 your homework will consist of the following things:

- Regular reading practice (five slots of at least 10 minutes each week)
- Spelling practice (writing your spellings in sentences)
- Maths practice (normally on a sheet that you stick in)
