### Earrings in school

All of our children have come back to school looking very smart in their uniforms, however, please may we draw your attention to the following section of the uniform policy.

*Ordinarily, jewellery is not appropriate for school. Watches and small stud earrings are permitted, although must be removed for P.E. lessons. Consequently, if considering having your child's ears pierced, please do so at the start of the summer holiday, so that they are able to remove them by the start of term. Please note that staff are not permitted to remove studs and earrings so if your child cannot remove them themselves they will not be able to participate in PE.*



Please also be aware that nail polish is not permitted to be worn in school and does not form part of the school uniform.

### Medication



Can we please remind all parents of Nottinghamshire County Council's policy on the administration of prescribed medication at school. We are only permitted to administer medication if it is prescribed **four** times a day. If your child has been prescribed medicine that needs to be given at school a form needs to be completed and signed before this can happen.
