#### **School meals**

If your child is moving into Year 3 in September, we want to remind you that you will have to pay for school meals (at £2.50 per day.). If you have any questions, please contact the school office.

If you are in receipt of any of these benefits below you could be eligible for Pupil Premium Funding. Not only will your child then receive free school meals and free milk but school also receives funding which we use on a variety of support strategies.

You can register your child for Pupil Premium Funding if you get any of these benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax
  Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

# Neurodiversity Survey – only 7 days left to respond!

In September 2024, our school will be participating in the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools Project (PINS), closely supported by the Nottinghamshire Parent Carer forum (PCF). Through collaboration, the project will bring health and education specialists and expert parent carers into our school to provide training to improve outcomes for our children.

To support preparations for this project we would be very grateful if you could complete the survey below. The parent carer survey has been developed nationally and is designed to gather insights from parents and carers of children attending the schools involved in the PINS project. The information collected will help to understand the current strengths and identify potential areas for improvement within the school environment. The survey intentionally covers broad aspects of school life, parent carers' experiences, and their views on their child's experience at school.
