Can I please offer a little reminder about school uniform policy <u>Uniform Policy.pdf</u> (<u>edgewoodprimaryschool.co.uk</u>) as there are a small number of pupils who aren't currently in correct shoes or uniform. We will be sending text messages out next week to those parents.

Can I also please draw your attention to an update regarding the changes in attendance guidance for schools <u>Edgewood attendance change letter 2024.pdf</u> (<u>edgewoodprimaryschool.co.uk</u>) As the letter states, we still cannot authorise any holidays during term times (which has always been our policy) but we now must issue fines for all unauthorised holidays taken during term time (where we used to allow 1 unauthorised holiday before). The exceptions are very few and far between and generally limited to strict religious observations and cases where key workers cannot take breaks during the school holidays. Holidays booked before this change in guidance but taken after 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024 are NOT exempt from this and we will have to issue fines for them. These are not school decisions, but ones mandated by the Department for Education.



This project is independent of schools, or the educational dept of Nottinghamshire County Council. It is funded by Health and is being run by Nottinghamshire Parent Carer Forum - an independent charity run by and for parent carers.

Our school is participating in the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools Project (PINS), closely supported by the Nottinghamshire Parent Carer forum (PCF). Through collaboration, the project will bring health and education specialists and expert parent carers into our school to provide training to improve outcomes for our



children who find aspects of their life challenging. This can be academically, socially and/or emotionally.

Our first parent and carer event is on Wednesday 11th September 1.30-3.00pm in school. This is an opportunity for you to come along and chat about things which are important to you and your child. Refreshments, cake and biscuits will be required.

It would be helpful if you could inform the office if you wish to attend, however this is not a necessity.

To support preparations for this project we would be very grateful if you could complete the survey below. The parent carer survey has been developed nationally and is designed to gather insights from parents and carers of children attending the schools involved in the PINS project. The information collected will help to understand the current strengths and identify potential areas for improvement within the school environment. The survey intentionally covers broad aspects of school life, parent carers' experiences, and their views on their child's experience at school.

Our school will receive an overview of the results, however please be assured feedback given is completey anonymised. The survey will be open to ALL parent carer response from 28<sup>th</sup> June - 12th July.
