We will be celebrating Christmas Jumper Day on Friday 12th December this year.




Christmas Elf Disco

Recently released historical fiction book recommendations



War Dog
Tom Palmer

KS1 historical fiction

A moving picture book that tells the true story of Judy, a brave dog who served as the mascot aboard HMS Grasshopper during the Second World War. Loved by her crew, Judy helps by catching rats, watching for danger, and comforting the soldiers through difficult times. When the crew are captured and Judy is separated from her dearest companion, Frank, she must summon extraordinary courage to survive and help those around her. She was the only animal ever made a prisoner of war and received the Dickin Medal for her service. A fact section at the end explores the role of animals in conflict.



Windrush Child John Agard

KS1 historical fiction


A beautifully illustrated picture book that tells the story of a young boy leaving his Caribbean home, family, and familiar shores to begin a new life in England. Aboard the Empire Windrush, he listens to his parents' bedtime stories of island life, colourful memories, and juicy mangoes as he drifts to sleep. Upon arrival, he faces the challenges of a new country, school and friendships, and eagerly writes to his grandmother about his journey and experiences. This captures the journey of thousands of Caribbean families who came to Britain as part of the Windrush Generation between 1948 and 1971.



My Family The Enemy Karen McCombie

KS2 historical fiction

A heartbreaking but heartwarming WWI story about finding hope in dark times based on true events. London, 1914. Fred Müller is a baker's son with a loving family. He's popular at school and intrigued by the whispers about an upcoming war. But when Britain does go to war, everyone with German heritage is under suspicion. Overnight, the Müllers become targets. The bakery window is smashed, neighbours turn cold, and Fred's father Walter is interned in Alexandra Palace. Can the Müllers stick together, and will friendship and kindness outlast fear? This topical novel is a great curriculum-linked read for Remembrance Day, encouraging empathy and spotlighting the lives of people on the British home front.




The Domesday Cows

KS2 historical fiction



Read for a hilarious culture clash, well-meaning sibling hijinks, confused cattle, and a headstrong girl who cannot seem to stay out of trouble. This book by historical fiction star Iszi Lawrence uses buckets of humour and weird facts about the era to build a love of reading
