Holiday Activity and Food programme (HAF)

Nottinghamshire County Council will start to take bookings for the 2024 Holiday Activities and Food programme (HAF) on Monday 1st July, ready for the summer holidays. HAF provides FUNDED activities and food for children receiving benefits related free school meals. These programmes run during the following school holidays: spring (Easter), summer, autumn (October) and Christmas holidays.

Children aged between 5 – 16 years (Reception aged 4 and year 11 inclusive) in receipt of benefits related free school meals are eligible for free holiday activities and food. This is not a food voucher scheme; all activities happen face to face.

Are you claiming benefitsrelated free school meals and looking for holiday clubs this summer?

The HAF programme supports the wellbeing of children aged between 5 to 16 years focussing on physical and mental wellbeing by providing a variety of activities during school holidays. Included in each session is a meal, this may be breakfast or lunch depending on the programme offered.

The aim of the Nottinghamshire Holiday Activities and Food programme is to support children to eat healthily, keep active and meet friends. We also support families to access help and advice when needed. Eligible children and young people will be able to access up to 24 days holiday activity each year.

The programme offer is wide and varied. Current activities include:

- multisports
- activity days high ropes
- dance
 drama
- forest school
- craft sessions
- cooking with children
- virtual reality
- children and families.

Providers are DBS checked and OfSted registered where required. There are several checks that providers must pass to be a deliverer of the programme, to ensure your child is in the safest of hands.
